### Central and local governments

### City and community municipal organisations

City and community organisations and leaders are on the front line and provide a specific locational context to sustainability themes, both in terms of the destructive impact that poor economic development practices are having on their cities and communities and in mounting effective responses to these practices. Their experiences are important to shaping appropriate responses.



### Financial Institutions

Financial institutions are critical in supporting stakeholders through innovative financing solutions and business models. It must be recognised that government and municipal organisations operate within tight budgetary constraints.



### Academia

Academia provides crucial support in understanding the current situational context and potential future scenarios for sustainability related themes together with the development of suitable technologies as solutions. Science is crucial in achieving sustainable development.

### RCE MELAKA: REGIONAL ESD HUB

The Green Growth Asia Foundation had established RCE Melaka; a centre that aims to be fully operational by January 2022. The RCE Melaka are officially recognised by the United Nations University and it will be joining the 179 members strong network to promote education for sustainable development. RCE Melaka will certainly provide linkage with other RCEs in Malaysia and globally, to provide a lasting impact on the community and environments by collectively finding solutions for environmental problems through education.



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
